The 10th International Conference on Direct Reactions with Exotic Beams DREB2018

Matsue, Japan, June 4-8, 2018

The 10th International Conference on Direct Reactions with Exotic Beams (DREB) 2018 will be held at Kunibiki Messe, Matsue, Japan June 4-8, 2018. The conference is jointly organized by the School of Science, Tokyo Institute of Technology (Tokyo, Japan) and RCNP, Osaka University (Suita, Japan), and also supported by RIKEN Nishina Center (Wako, Japan) and CNS, University of Tokyo (Wako, Japan). This conference is partially supported by ANPhA (Asian Nuclear Physics Association). The scientific program will be devoted to the latest experimental and theoretical research and developments in nuclear reactions with exotic nuclei. The topics will include the following subjects relevant to direct reactions:

- > Spectroscopy of exotic nuclei, such as drip-line and unbound nuclei
- Shell structure and its evolution
- Bulk properties and collective excitations
- Nuclear astrophysics
- Nuclear force
- Advances in direct reaction theory
- New instrumentation for direct reaction studies

Poster presentations Poster boards (1200 x 2100 mm) will be provided and fit A0 sized posters in portrait orientation. The abstract ID number will be attached in the board. Posters should be put up on Monday morning and will have to be taken down on Thursday evening. The main poster sessions are held on Monday evening, and the poster sessions continue throughout the coffee breaks. We encourage poster presenters to be available near their poster to engage in active discussions. The posters made and presented by BSc/MSc/Ph.D. students will enter to be reviewed for Poser Prize (ANPhA Prize). The best poster prize for experiment and theory will be announced and the winners are awarded in the closing session on Friday.

3. Exhibitor

The exhibitor desks will be located in the entrance area of Multi-purpose Hall in Kunibiki Messe. Exhibitor desks can be set up on Monday morning, and will remain open until Friday morning.

4. Lunch

From Local Airport (Izumo or Yonago) to Matsue City:

There are two airports, Izumo and Yonago, near the City of Matsue. When you arrive at either airport, we strongly recommend you to take a **Limousine (Airport Connection)** bus to Matsue Station (= JR Matsue Station), which is conveniently scheduled according to the arrival time of each flight. The bus is expected to wait until all the baggage claims are finished in each flight.

From Yonago Airport to Matsue Station: Fare 990 JPY. Takes about 45min.

From Izumo Airport to JR Matsue Station: Fare 1,030 JPY. Takes about half an hour. http://www.izumo-airport.co.jp/ (Please use "Foreign Language" button for translation.)

When you reach JR Matsue Station, and if you are not sure about the hotel location, try to find Matsue International Tourist Information office just in front of the station. It is open from 9:00-19:00. You can ask questions in English/Chinese/Korean there.
